


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AKTION REGEN

Family planning is a key element in reducing poverty!






Rain Worker Training Program




Fertility in Africa

"Africa's high birth rate is keeping the continent poor"

(The Economist 22.09.2018)

In 2019, the fertility rate in Sub Saharan Africa was around 5 children per woman. In Europe, the average fertility rate is 1.6 children per woman, compared to a global average of 2.5 children.



The population of Africa grows rapidly:

- » The current population of Africa is five times its size in 1950!
- » Its inhabitants will double from 1.2 billion to 2.4 billion until 2050.
- » Many of the fastest growing populations are in the poorest countries, where population growth brings additional challenges in the effort to eradicate poverty, achieve greater equality, combat hunger and malnutrition and strengthen health and education systems.

Overpopulation

Human overpopulation is when there are too many people for the environment to sustain with food, drinkable water, breathable air, resources, etc.



Worldwide population growth is almost entirely due to developing countries. Three factors play a significant role:

» More than two children per couple

The young age structure of the population Nearly half of the African population is under 15 years old. All of them are coming into reproductive age.

If a couple has two children the population remains stable. If a couple has four, five, six, or even more children, the population of a country will double or be three times more within one generation!

» 43% of all pregnancies in countries of the Global South are unwanted

Although contraceptives are often available, many people do not use them since religious and/or traditional prejudices hinder them.

CONSEQUENCES OF OVERPOPULATION

- ♦ Exhaustion of natural resources
- ▲ Environmental destruction
- Shortage of food and water
- ▲ Increasing poverty
- ♦ Crime, social revolt, conflicts

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Overpopulation is one of the biggest challenges humanity is facing and threatens the near future of the planet in economic, environmental and social terms!
